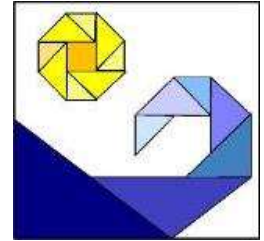

Trunk Show - "Oompah! Accordion Sewn HSTs™"

What happens when you have a designer who not only wants to be as scrappy as possible but also hates wasting fabric? Well, all sorts of things, because that's pretty much the definition of scrappy. But I took it one step further, and figured out a way to create HSTs that don't have a twin, and waste no fabric, by sewing HSTs in "accordions." Add another step, and you can sew the blocks for an entire quilt in individual accordions that come together almost like magic. It's the coolest thing I've ever come up with (if I do say) and you'll see the quilts from my book "Oompah! Jazz Up Your Scrap Quilts With the Accordion Sewn HSTs Method" plus a few surprise treats. You'll want to pick up your accordion and join the oompah sensation!

The magic of movement in quilts

Why should we worry about creating movement in our compositions? Interest. While color, pattern, and workmanship create beauty, movement creates interest. It's a guaranteed "wow factor" and adds certain sophistication. We can create it using appliqué, adjusting a composition, incorporating asymmetrical shapes, and unique border treatments. In writing patterns for over 20 years I've seen how movement in a composition absolutely draws people

in. I'll show you lots of unique ways to create it often with a bit of humor that seems to just delight.

Announcing . . . The 2021 Quilters By the Sea Quilt Tour

10am - 3pm, Saturday, April 24, 2021 \$10

The first planning meeting for the 2021 quilt exhibit was a great success! OBS will have a quilt tour: 6-8 outside locations displaying 4-8 members' quilts at each address. In addition to displayed quilts, there will be opportunity baskets and a participation drawing with prizes! We encourage you to park and walk the quilts, however masks and physical distancing will be obsessively enforced! Family, friends, neighbors and other guilds are welcome to join us.

At the beginning of April (and upon payment), you will be emailed addresses and a tour program. On April 24th, pack some snacks and wander around viewing quilts.

As in real estate “location, location, location” is important. We are looking for six to eight members to volunteer their front yards to display six to ten quilts. These sites could be expanded to neighbors’ yards with their agreement. There will be at least four members assigned to each site; half can tour the quilts in the morning and then the other half gets to take the tour. [Quilting/friendship circles may volunteer a common site.] Sites are not expected to provide bathroom facilities or other amenities. Currently we have three confirmed sites. It cannot be overly stressed how important it is to have enough sites to display our quilts! [Sorry-no gated communities will be considered.]

By mid-December we will have an entry form made and distributed to collect the usual quilt show info: quilt title, maker, quilter, etc. Some of this information will go into our program (just as we do for a traditional quilt show).

We decided not to include any selling – no boutique or Red Hen sales. Sorry, no vendors, either!

The next steps- 1) get confirmed sites, 2) a list of available quilt racks/display options, and 3) commitments to make opportunity baskets.

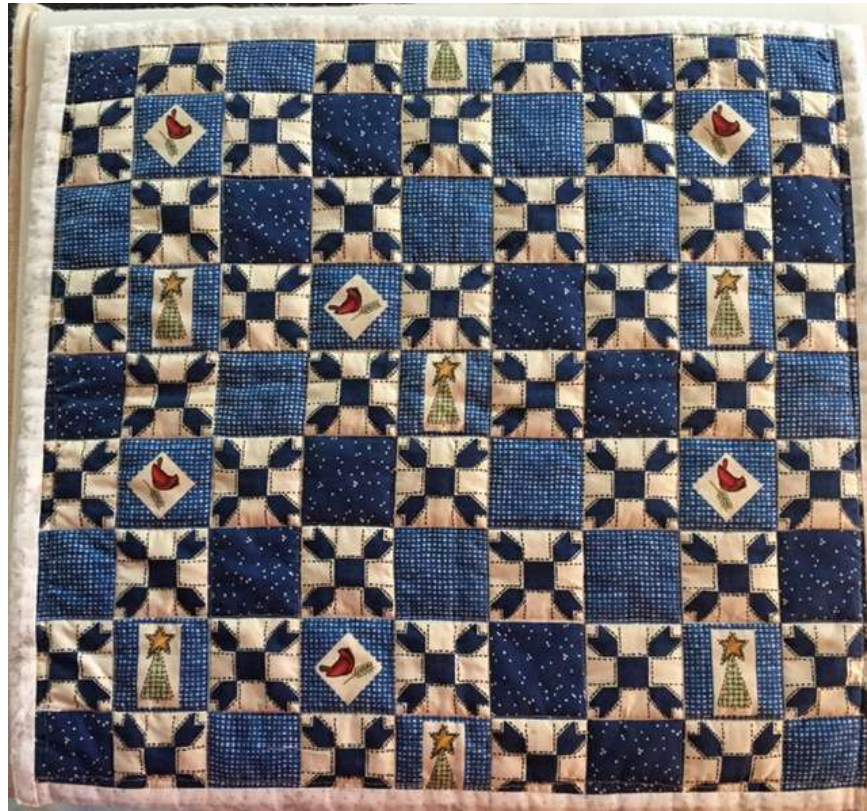

Directions:

Sew a sashing strip between 2 matching print strips. Crosscut at 8". Repeat for each print. (24 sets needed - discard the extra set)



Crosscut the 12 remaining sashing strips at 10" (48 pieces needed). Sew strips to both sides of 24 sets. (24 blocks)



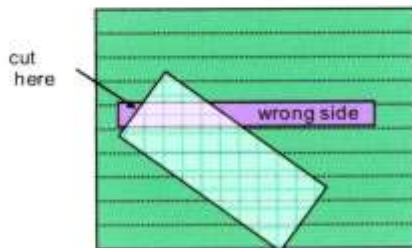
Alternating the direction of the blocks, sew blocks into a 4 x 6 grid.

Sew the 2" accent strips to the top and bottom. Sew the 1 1/2" accent strips to the sides. Add borders, quilt, and bind.

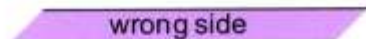
Perfect Fit Binding Technique

Follow these steps exactly for easy, attractive binding with no bumpy seam joinings to be hand sewn.

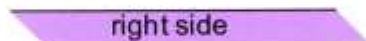
1. Lay your 2 1/2" binding strips **right-side down** on your cutting mat.
2. Use the 45 degree mark on your rotary ruler to trim the left end of your strips. Make sure you cut the angle as shown below:



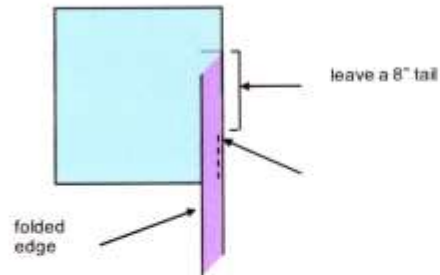
3. Trim the other end of the binding strips at the same angle. The strips should look like this:



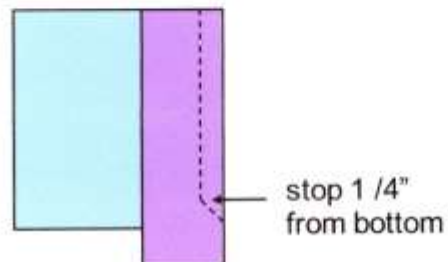
4. Sew all the strips together, so that you have one long strip.
5. Fold the binding in half lengthwise and press. (If you roll up the binding around your fist after it is ironed, it will be easier to work with.) Now it will look like this:



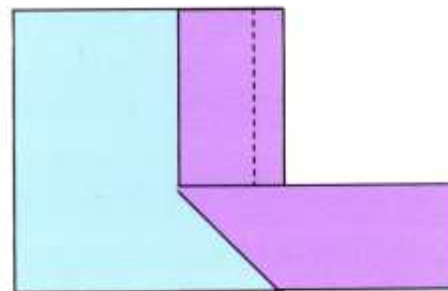
6. Leaving a 8" tail and using a 1/4" seam, start sewing your binding to the right side of your quilt. Stop when you are 1/4" away from the first corner.



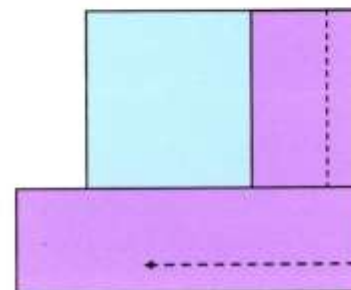
7. Sew off the quilt diagonally.



8. Fold the binding to the right on the sewn diagonal line.

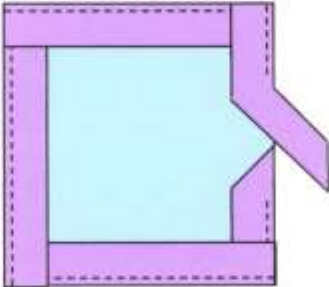


9. Now fold it back on itself and continue sewing down the second side.

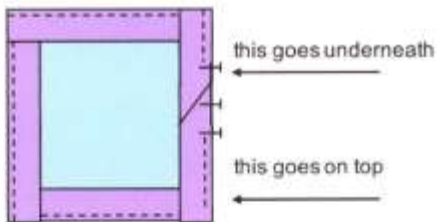


Perfect Fit Binding Technique

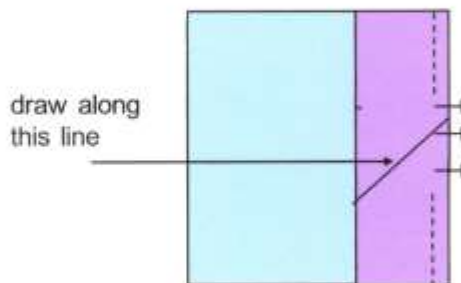
10. Repeat process on all 4 corners.
When you are sewing the final side, stop when you are about 8" away from the starting end of the binding.



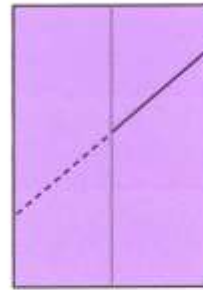
11. Pin down the edge of the binding that you just finished sewing until it is underneath the 8" piece you left loose when you started. Now, with the starting piece **on top**, pin down the starting 6" of binding.



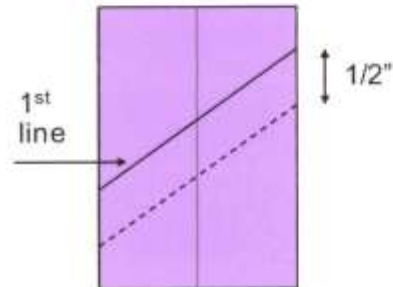
12. Use chalk or a water-soluble marker to draw a line along the diagonal edge.



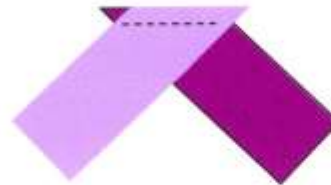
13. Remove the pins and open out the top piece of the binding. Use a ruler to extend the line all the way across the binding.



14. Use the ruler again to draw another line 1/2" **BELOW** this line. Make sure you are **adding** 1/2" to the length of the binding! This is for the seam allowances.

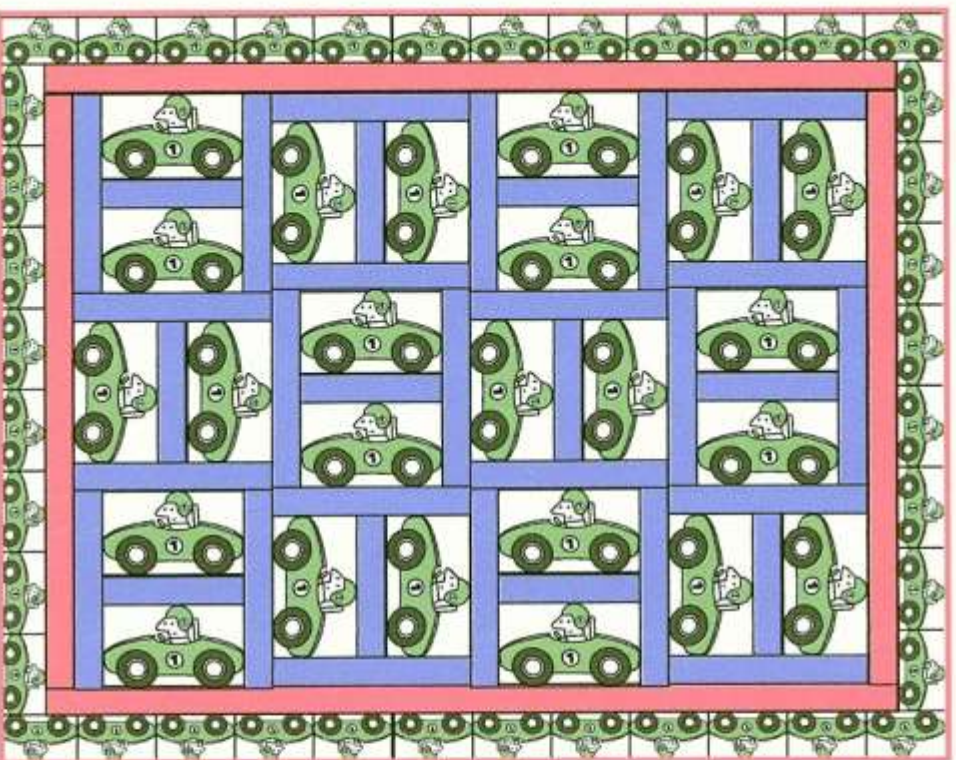


15. Cut the binding on the second line. Place the binding edges right sides together, pin, and sew using a 1/4" seam allowance.



16. Trim off the points and finger-press the seam open.
17. Refold the binding and finish sewing to the quilt. The binding will fit perfectly.

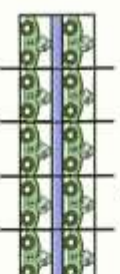

Directions:

Sew a sashing strip between 2 print strips. Crosscut at 8". Repeat twice. (12 blocks needed)



Crosscut the 8 remaining sashing strips at 11" (24 pieces needed). Sew strips to both sides of blocks.



Alternating the direction of the blocks, sew blocks into a 3 x 4 grid.

Sew the accent strips around the grid. Add borders, quilt, and bind.

Speedy Burrito Pillowcases

Standard 20" x 30"



Materials:

¾ yd Main Pillowcase Fabric cut 27" x wof = 27 x 40-42

¼ yd Cuff cut 9" x wof

1 ½ to 3" wof Accent Fabric

For additional sizes

Queen and King use 7/8 yd Main Fabric. Same Cuff and accent

Queen 20" x 33", King 20" x 36"

Directions:

1. Place cuff fabric right side up. Layer the main pillowcase fabric on top of it, right side up, aligning the top raw edges. Fold accent fabric in half along long edge / lengthwise. Iron. Line up the raw edges of the folded accent strip with the top raw edges of the other two fabrics. (Note: Fabrics may not be same WOF. Keep on side even to allow minimal amount of trimming to one side.)
2. Roll up main fabric by starting at the bottom and working your way up. Roll the main fabric panel into a little tube or "burrito." Stop when you get to the center of the cuff fabric.
3. Bring the bottom edge of the cuff fabric up and over the burrito. Wrong side up. Align the raw edges. Pin in place, making sure to trap the accent strip. Stitch along the raw edges with a ¼" to 3/8" seam allowance, or use a serger to finish the edge. It should now look like a long fabric burrito.
4. Unroll and Press by gently tugging and pulling at the main fabric inside the burrito out of the tube. Continue pulling your pillowcase from the inside out.
5. Once it's fully unrolled, lay flat and press the wrinkles out, making sure the accent strip lays flat and in the same direction.
6. Trim the pillowcase to 28" (33" or 36") long, measuring from the top of the cuff to the opposite end. Then, fold the pillowcase in half, right sides together. Finger press any wrinkles out, and align the accent strip so each half is laying on top of the other. (If needed, you can pin it in place.) Trim the pillowcase to 20" wide (which will give you a 40" total width).
7. Finish the Sides and Bottom of pillowcase in any one of the following ways.
 - a. **French Seams:** Fold the pillowcase in half, wrong sides together (right sides should be facing out). Stitch together with a ¼" seam allowance. (Note: You will only sew the two sides with raw edges.) Trim the raw edges down to a slim ¼".
 - b. **Serger:** Fold the pillowcase in half, then serge the raw edges on the top and right sides only. Turn right side out and press.
 - c. **Overlock:** Stitch side and bottom seams with either an overlock or regular machine. If using an overlock, bring the tread tail at the top of the cuff, back down between the cuff and the seam and zigzag over the seam allowance to secure the stitching.
 - d. Turn, Press and fold.
