### **Cathe Hagerman-Beizer**







## Worm Quilt – Basketweave

(48" x 64")



### Yardage

Worms 22 2 1/2" light (L) selvage to selvage strips 22 2 1/2" dark (D) selvage to selvage strips

Backing Binding 1/2 yd (15" binding)

### Cut

Binding

6 strips @ 2 1/2"


Make the following stratas by sewing the light and dark worms together along the

- long side: 2 stratas of L-D-L-D-L
- 2 stratas of D-L-D-L-D
- 4 stratas of L-D-L
  - (5 worms in each strata) (5 worms in each strata)
- 4 stratas of D-L-D

(3 worms in each strata) (3 worms in each strata)

Press all seams in same direction.

pieces to get the last 4 needed 6 1/2" X 6 1/2" squares. at 6 1/2" x 6 1/2". Remove 2 strips from each of the 5 strata 6 1/2" x 10 1/2" up with a total of 12 blocks @ 10 1/2", 24 blocks at 6 1/2" x 10 1/2", and 8 blocks From each of the stratas, cross cut 3 at 10 1/2" and 1 at 6 1/2". You should wind



to make a total of 12 blocks. Use one large, 2 medium and one small block to construct a larger block. Repeat




the rows together. Construct a 3 x 4 block grid by sewing the blocks together in rows, then sewing

# Worm Quilt – Trip Around the Worm

(48" x 62")



### Yardage

Backing Solid 25 1 3/4 yds (39" for borders, 15" for binding) 2 1/2" assorted selvage to selvage strips ("worms")

Binding Solid 11 strips @ 3 1/2" 6 strips @ 2-1/2"


## Crosscut the 3 1/2" strips (remove selvages first): 2 @ 38 1/2" (B)

2 @ 30 1/2" (G) and 6 1/2" (A)

Sew the 7 remaining 3 1/2" border strips into one long strip. From it cut:

2 @ 26 1/2" 2 @ 48 1/2" 2 @ 56 1/2"

Sew the worms together along the long side in sets of 3 (8 sets total). There will be one worm left over. Crosscut all sets plus the single worm



Using the singles as needed, sew together the following strip sets:

2 sets of 6 (3 + 3) 1 set of 10 (3 + 3 + 3 + 1)

2 sets of 15 (3 x 5) 2 sets of 19 (3 x 6 + 1) 2 sets of 28 (3 x 9 + 1)

in each strip set
