Sign up to help set up, work at, or take down show displays at the four quilt locations. Donate items to the Marketplace (Linda M. and Jody), the Boutique (Terry G ) and get your quilts entered (online). We love seeing our members' quilts; this is our guild's very public Show and Tell. Time to show off your quilts ladies and gentlemen!


Everyone was invited to a meeting (via in-person/Zoom) to discuss budget concerns. Our expenses (rent, insurance, speakers, storage unit, Programs and Workshops and more) are on track to exceed our income (membership, Quilt Show, Opportunity Quilt, etc.) by about $\$ 4,000$ this year. We have a significant reserve set aside to cover the shortfall. The QBS Board will be focusing on balancing budget. We want to be fiscally responsible.


Speaking of money, have you sold your Opportunity Quilt tickets? This is a major fundraiser for our guild. Income from this raffle alone pays for about 25-30\% of our operating expenses. These funds help to pay for renting the church for meetings and workshops. Please turn in money and ticket stubs to Cathe HB.

The Board will be discussing options and possibilities to reduce expenses and increase income. We need to be informed to make thoughtful decisions. Please take a quick survey by clicking on the link below.

The 3D Cube quilt is an interesting variation of the tumbling block pattern. The cube effect is caused by the positioning of the light, medium, and dark fabrics. The best results are achieved when there is a strong light/medium/dark contrast.

## National Quilt Day

Annually: $3^{\text {rd }}$ Saturday in March

The origin of the quilting day can be traced to the Quilters Day Out, which was organized by the Kentucky Heritage Quilt Society in 1989 to celebrate the ancient tradition and its practice in the state of Kentucky. Two years later, this event became so popular that the National Quilting Association decided to declare an official holiday for quilting. From this day, the name changed from Quilters Day Out to National Quilting Day. Over the years, this event has attracted people to celebrate from all over the world and participate in helping to build and maintain the global heritage of quilting.

## HOW TO CELEBRATE NATIONAL QUILTING DAY

## 1. Hang quilts outdoors

On National Quilting Day, quilts are hung outside the homes to educate and inspire people to join in celebrating this ancient creative skill and as a sign that you recognize this event and that you are observing it.

## 2. Show your quilting skills

This holiday is a time to share your skills with others by offering to teach a simple quilt project and showing them how it's done. You can decide to teach this to your relatives/family members, schools, neighbors, friends, or a youth group.

## 3. Make it a service day

On this day, you can work on a quilt for your favorite cause - either national or local projects. Work on a Community Relations quilt. Stop by Carollynn's garage on March 18 if you need a quilt kit.
