Happy Fourth of July!

As Americans, we are some of the luckiest people in the world, because we are governed by people we vote for. As a QBS member, you enjoy that same privilege with the guild. Last September you voted for members to fill QBS Board positions: President, VPs of Programs and Workshop, and so forth. You decided that the Board could make most decisions for the guild, but you aren't off the hook for making some guild decisions, too! Did you realize that?

One of our purposes is "quilting education." Quilting education is also providing members with opportunities to learn new techniques, pattern construction; exposure to different styles (modern, traditional) and materials, and the list goes on. In QBS, we provide educational experiences through our speakers and their slides / trunk shows, and in our workshops where we try out new methods and techniques, and maybe pushed a bit beyond our comfort zone.

Why am I writing to you about this?

Speakers and workshop leaders (often the same person) are expensive. This is planned for in our budget; a large portion of our annual dues is expended for the speakers, as well as workshops (which are primarily supported by fees we pay to attend). Ideally, the workshops would pay for themselves, but that is not happening with much regularity. For example, July's workshop was an expense of \$650. With only three people registered for the workshop (3x\$60=\$180), the decision was made to cancel it. We simply couldn't afford to subsidize that large an expense.

We try to keep expenses lower by contracting with SoCal presenters and that is giving us a dilemma. We are starting to repeat the speakers and workshops we had 4-5-6 years ago, and they seem to be teaching the same thing now that they taught then.

How do we get beyond the "same old thing"? Your input is needed!

Why now? Now is when guilds start contracting with teachers for the next calendar year.

Suggestions have been made to share expenses with one or two other guilds to bring a fabulous speaker /workshop here. Great idea, however, QBS members would need to be flexible. Would you be willing to occasionally meet at a different time or day (not all the time, but for whiz-bang teachers)? Above all, would you come?

And what about Zooming with long distance presenters? We got a taste of this during the pandemic and it went well. Should we look at one or two Zoom presenters? Those without Zoom capability could participate with someone who does Zoom.

Again, talk to us! Tell me (Kate), April (VP Programs), or Wendy (VPs Workshop) what you think, so we can make informed decisions for our guild. Telling us what you want is what YOU are responsible for.





1st Quarter Audit January 1 - March 31, 2023

The following QBS Audit is in accordance with documented procedures based on the QBS By-Laws as amended in September 2021 and QBS Standard Rules dated September 2021. Per the revised By-Laws, the guild may conduct meetings virtually.

This audit commenced on May 28, 2023. The current Treasurer is Ms. Lori Davies.

The QBS Audit for the period of January - March 2023:

- Substantiated the approved Budget of Revenue and Expenditures for 2023 have been updated monthly and presented to the QBS Board as required. All Income has been properly documented, and all disbursement requests have been documented and have the requisite signatures.
- Indicated that all expenditures greater than \$200.00 were approved by the QBS Voting Membership. There were expenditures greater than the \$200 threshold, but they were previously approved by the QBS Board.
- Indicates that all contracts executed included the vendor, date, purpose, terms, amount, quantities and any required QBS Board approval.
- Binder contains QBS Approved Budgets and bank statements for the Checking and Money Market Accounts.
- Included donations to charities the guild supports.
- Found all reimbursement requests were properly completed and all required documents are attached (i.e., receipts). There are no discrepancies.
- There were no cancelled workshops where refunds were required.
- The bank statements were reconciled against the records in the Treasurer's binder. There are no concerns relative to the accounts.




I'm Kim Jamieson-Hirst of <u>Chatterbox Quilts</u>. You may've seen my quilting videos on my <u>Chatterbox Quilts</u>' You<u>Tube channel</u> or know me as a Janome Canada artisan or a Michael Miller Fabric Ambassador for 2023.

In July 2023 I'll be hosting my annual <u>Wrangle Your Scraps Challenge</u> and I wanted to advise you of this upcoming online challenge as I believe that your members may be interested in it.

This 5-day online challenge is for quilters who are feeling overwhelmed by their leftover fabric scraps and need help to get them sorted, organized, and stored so they are ready for us in future quilt projects. Having a wellorganized fabric scrap inventory makes it easy and efficient to pull appropriate fabrics for an upcoming project.

In this 5-day online challenge, participants will have daily pre-recorded videos to instruct them on what to do each day of the challenge. Each day they will need between 30 - 60 minutes to complete that day's challenge. At the end of the 5 days, they will have neatly organized fabric scraps and will be ready to make the Diamond Bright project. The pattern and step-by



I've also included a **bonus** for 2023 which is 5 daily ZOOM sessions with me so I will be with participants each day to keep them motivated and working on the challenge.

The fee for the entire <u>Wrangle Your Scraps Challenge</u>, including all of the pre-recorded videos, the Diamond Bright pattern and videos, as well as the private online group and the bonus of 5 daily ZOOM sessions with me during the challenge is **\$29.99 USD** (other currencies available).
