JANUARY 13 \$35.00 Sewing Machine Hands-On



Steve Shuman leads this workshop investigating your sewing machine. Basic maintenance tips; how, when, and where to oil and clean. Steve will specifically look at each machine and give individualized service tips. Supply list: your machine(s), sewing machine tools (screw driver, lint brush), fabric scraps, thread, scissors. Steve will check one machine for each person and then will do additional machines as time permits. If multiple people have the same machine, he will demonstrate how to work on one while to rest of us observe and take notes.

FEBRUARY 10 \$35.00 California Heritage Quilt Project (CHQP) Registration



Bring your finished quilt and register/document it on the Quilt Index, an international repository for everything quilts! CHQP is a member; all California residents can enter quilts under the California Heritage Quilt Project. This is not a sewing workshop.




Stepping Stones (40" x 50")

Community Relations - Free Pattern



Directions:

Sew a sashing strip between 2 print strips. Crosscut at 8" Repeat twice. (12 blocks needed)




Crosscut the 8 remaining sashing strips at 11" (24 pieces needed). Sew strips to both sides of blocks.



Alternating the direction of the blocks, sew blocks into a 3 x 4

Sew the accent strips around the grid. Add borders, quilt, and bind
