

# Quilt Index Registry

We have beta tested the process for registering quilts into the Quilt Index. A Thank you" to Terry Gutierrez for being our willing guinea pig with two quilts to register. The first quilt took us two hours and included re-entering data we thought we d lost. The second quilt took 35 minutes! What a difference experience makes! We learned quite a bit and I hope the process will become easier and quicker. It's called a practice for a reason. I encourage everyone to register their quilts into the Index. Yours could be next! You can definitely register your quilts on your own. I am here to help those that may think they can't do it on their own and would like support.

Here s what we discovered while registering our first two quilts:

- -Forms must be filled out completely before sitting down to input the information. Measure your quilt, write up your quilt history, take pictures if you can, put all the pertinent information on paper first so we can just data enter and clarify information. If you need to call cousin Sarah in Chattanooga for relevant info, please do it ahead of time.
- -Photo size matters! The quilt photos must be sent as a "small" image in your email. I learned this the hard way. I submitted one quilt three times before I figured out it was the large photos that were not allowing me to complete the submission. I lost the info and had to re-enter all the information.
- -Registering your quilt is an important process and I am committed to help anyone that wants the help or guidance. I'm in this for the long term. It was so sweet to document quilters' stories and to help share their craft with future generations. It makes my heart smile to help you tell your quilt stories.

Please see me, Tish Granillo, at the next guild meeting to sign up your quilts (limit two quilts per quilter—to start). I will enter them into the Index during our regularly scheduled workshops. I'll bring submission forms for those that can't print them at home. **Happy Quilting!**
