SCCQG plays an important role for numerous quilt guilds throughout Southern California. One of the critical provisions of SCCQG is to offer a group insurance policy that covers

liability insurance for guilds. They also provide a program called "Meet The Teachers" that introduces teachers/ presenters to the guilds called. SCCQG additionally offers a quarterly newsletter that can help promote each guild to the other member guilds. They also have website postings that show quilt guild programs and quilt shows in order to eliminate scheduling conflicts.

September 14 - Hexies and Christmas English Paper Piecing with Dr. Deb Belcher.




The history of English Paper Piecing goes back to the

October 12 – The Little Ghost Who Was a Quilt with Lori





All of us at For The Child are grateful for your generous donation of \$300.00 (Check # 1259 on 6/1/2024).

Your gift will be used to provide mental health care, court advocacy, and other support services for uninsured children and teens who come to our Child Abuse & Neglect Safety Net Program for help. June is a busy time as we plan workshops and family support activities to give children and teens the support they need, along with their therapy, during the summer break from school.

We are thankful to everyone who has helped sewing hundred of adorable stuffed animals so that we can share them with children safely!

Summer also brings exciting news for our future! Construction will begin this month to expand our facility at 4565 California Avenue to add a new wing with 2,299 square feet. This will give space for five more therapists, interns, and a case manager, increasing our ability to serve 100+ additional children and teens by the end of 2025. The need is especially great for young teens since the pandemic, with a growing number sexually assaulted or trafficked in crimes that begin with predators connecting with victims on social media. The building expansion is funded by a lead gift from the John Gogian Family Foundation, and major gifts from the Keck and Ahmanson Foundation, along with support from Boeing Employees and other private donors.

We are thankful for your donation and for sharing our mission as we celebrate **50 Years of Service** and look ahead to the future needs of children and teens in our community.







Yardage:

Pink 1 yd (31") Blue 1 yd (31") Black 1 yd (32")

Border/Binding 1 1/4 yd (42": border 27", binding 15")

Backing 3 yds

Cut

Pink 3 @ 7 1/2" x WOF 2 @ 4" x WOF

Blue 3 @ 7 1/2" x WOF

2 @ 4" x WOF

Black 8 @ 4" x WOF Border 6 @ 4 1/2" x WOF Binding 6 @ 2 1/2" x WOF


Sew

Take **ONE** pink 7 ½" strip, **ONE** blue 7 ½" strip, and **ONE** black strip and cut in half. Take **ONE half-strip** of each color and trim to 4".

Sew a black strip to the tops of the 7 ½" pink strips. Press towards black. Cross cut the strata at 4". Repeat with the 7 ½" blue strips. (24 each color)



Sew the remaining pink, blue, and black 4" strips together in stratas. Press towards black. Cross cut at 4" (24 total)



Sew the pieces together to form blocks.



Arrange blocks in a 4 x 6 grid, starting the 1st row with the pink on the left and the 2nd row with blue on the left. Rotate every other block to form the pattern show at left.

Sew blocks into rows, then sew rows together.

Sew border strips together in a loop, then cut halfway between two of the seams. Sew to top, bottom, then sides. Quilt and bind.



The Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds (a 501(c)(3) association) was organized for several purposes:

- To foster and promote knowledge and participation in the craft/art form of quilting, patchwork, appliqué, and all other aspects of quilt making.
- To act as an information network for quilt guilds with similar objectives in promoting continued interest in quilt making.
- To provide a forum for cooperative endeavors among all quilt guilds in Southern California and surrounding areas.
- To readily inform quilt guilds and individual quilters of resources available to them.
- To encourage development of friendships state, nation, and world-wide.
- To foster education through cooperative sharing of speakers, teachers, and programs for member guilds.
- To act as a resource for those wishing to organize new guilds.
- To maintain a calendar for quilting events in the Southern California geographic area and to make such information readily available.

MEETINGS

General meetings and Board meetings quarterly via Zoom We also host a New Reps meeting that is held quarterly via Zoom on the Friday before the general meeting.

PURPOSE OF A REPRESENTATIVE

The SCCQG Reps are the conduit from Council to their home guilds Information is shared via a newsletter article or a report at the guild board meeting

RESOURCES

PROGRAMS/MEETING TOPICS

- SCCQG presents 3 meetings a year; the fourth meeting is MTT and covered separately
- Meeting notes are available on the home page
- We often revisit topics to provide current and updated information every few years
- Administrative topics include legal matters, incorporation, corporate compliance, tax forms, fiscal documents, cyber security, board recruitment
- Popular topics include: social meeting, philanthropy, volunteer recruitment
- We welcome topic suggestions

MEET THE TEACHER

- Flagship event. This allows guilds to find teachers for their programs
- Old days in person Carson Civic Center started w/ 20 teachers then 50
- Now via Zoom with breakout rooms for each of 30 teachers

INSURANCE

- SCCQG offers a group policy for meetings and events (shows, teas, home tours, luncheons, outdoor shows)
- Guilds must opt-in to participate in the policy
- Cost for guilds is currently \$5.25 per member at the time of renewal
- Policy term is from September 29 through September 28 of the following year
- The policy is for liability coverage only.
- Guests covered; volunteers now covered; E&O for Board

MEMBERSHIP

- Categories: Guild, Teacher, Individual
- · Life Membership award after serving two 2-year terms on the SCCQG Board
- Use the officer update form (found on the Membership page) to provide name and contact information for your newly elected board members
- We ask all guilds to update their officer information after having elections

NEWSLETTER

- Always open to receiving articles about special projects in your guild
- Published March 1, June 1, September 1, December 1; Due date is usually the 1st of the month prior

WEBSITE POSTINGS

- Guilds are encouraged to review the SCCQG Calendar before scheduling an event. You
 do not want to have a quilt show with 2 other guilds having a show the same weekend
