

Batik Beauty (48" x 69")

<u>Yardage</u>

Batiks 22 strips @ 2 1/2" x →

Black 2 1/2 yds (86" - 50" sashing, 21"

border, 15" binding)

Backing 3 yds

Cut

Black 33 @ 1-1/2" x → (sashing)

6 @ 3-1/2" x → (border) 6 @ 2-1/2" x → (binding)

Directions:

Sew black/batik/black/batik/black strips together, in that order, along the long side. Repeat to get a total of 11 strata.

Measure the width of several stratas and take an average (will probably be about 7 1/4"). Use this measurement to crosscut them. (Total 54 blocks needed)



Arrange the blocks into a 6 x 9 grid, rotating every other block as shown. Sew into rows; sew rows together.


Sew on the top and bottom borders, then the sides.

Quilt, and bind.





A 2007 Gammill Optimum, 30" Throat on a 14-foot table with a Statler Stitcher Computerized System. Included is a stitch length regulator, leg casters, pivot access table, two sets of canvas leaders, a light bar, a built-in bobbin winder, laser light, a double small spool holder, horizontal channel locks, and an electronic needle positioner. Also included are over 1000 patterns, 80 cones of thread, needles, additional bobbin winder, 32 bobbins, surge protector, and some additional white and black batting.

Thank you to those members who stitched the Autumn Leaf (Maple Leaf) block for October. Congratulations to Kate Weber and Jody Baca who won a set of the blocks that were turned in.

The block for November is the Flying Geese block. There were printed instructions from the "Fat Quarter Shop" for the Fast Flying Geese method of making 4 blocks at a time (not published here due to copyright restrictions). We are making a $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x5" finished Flying Geese segment. The kits had 2 different focus fabrics and 8 background squares. This is enough fabric to make 8 segments. There was also a half-sheet of specific instructions on how to join the 8 segments into a larger block in one of four configurations (see below). Have fun arranging your block!

If you are struggling to make the blocks properly, visit www.FATQUARTERSHOP.com for a video tutorial.


Your kit will make 4 Flying Geese of each color. Follow the instructions on the "Fast Flying Geese Cheat Sheet" provided by the "Fat Quarter Shop". If you need help, there is an online tutorial.

You will make 8 total flying geese sections (A). Stitch them in pairs of matching colors (B), and then stitch the 4 "B" sections in one of the 4 configurations below.

I want to say a great big "Thank You" to Brad Dumm for graciously sharing his pattern for a 5-point star that is NOT paper pieced. It is simply pieced.


When Brad showed his "Stars" quilt for Show and Tell in July, he told us the story of how he searched high and low for a pattern for a 5-pointed star and wasn't able to find one. Several years ago, I too was trying to find a pattern for a 5-pointed star and the only patterns I could find were paper pieced. I gave in and paper-pieced the stars in my flag quilt. I wish I had thought to take this one step further and make my own piecing pattern but I am so very happy that Brad did just that.


The next 8 pages contain the templates for the 9 pieces of fabric you need to piece this star along with some notes from me. Some of the scans are a little light so if you see these lines "יִייִייִי along the edge that means that side of the fabric is the outside of the block.

Brad also included grain lines as well as a measuring tape so you can get your templates to the right scale and your pieces in the right direction. Brad gave me scanned hard copies that I, in turn, scanned into my PC and then I inserted them into this newsletter. Therefore, these pictures are probably not at 100%. You will need to adjust them to get them to 100%, or whatever size you want, for your stars. Brad's finishes at 12" so 12 1/2" unfinished. Brad - Thank you again, Patti.

Here is a layout to show you the final assembly of the pattern pieces.

You can cut them out of two fabrics and then swap the background pieces (i.e. 2, 4, 5, 7, and 9) to get a star and its reverse image. However, if you want all your stars to be the same, pieces 2, 4, 5, 7, and 9 are your background pieces. This means that pieces 1, 3, 6, and 8 are your star. Sew the pieces in the order of your choice. There are more pictures on the next page.







Cutting layout for all pieces to keep the grain correct.
