Sign up on the information pages at guild meetings for workshops that interest you. As the workshop date comes closer, register/pay for the workshop online or in person at guild meetings.

Online registration for 2025 workshops will be open on January 2, 2025. You may always pay and register at guild meetings.

January 11 - Photo Transfer. \$35

Learn from Anne Sonner how to transfer those family photos onto fabric so they can be included in your quilts and wall hangings. Everything you need will be at the workshop: computer, scanner, and color printer! This workshop is hands-on so you can do it yourself when the workshop is over!



February 13 - For the Love of Ric Rac. \$35

Ric Rac! It isn't just for doll clothes! Take the fear out of working with Ric Rac. Dawn Farrier, owner of The Creation Station Quilt Shop in Buellton, will show us how to round and turn corners and "join" the tails and change colors seamlessly. Two projects will be presented: receiving blanket and table runner. (Optional: \$25 kit available-everything you need for the receiving blanket shown here.)



March 13 - Into the Heat Set. \$35 and \$40 kit fee

In this class, you will learn to use a "collage with templates" technique. It is an innovative and revolutionary new technique. It is easy and foolproof and the results are amazing.



This technique leaves the quilt and the fabric soft and manageable, not stiff and board-like, as fusible webs and glues do. The best, however, is that you can do raw edge applique without any fraying edges!! This technique produces a no-fray raw edge applique as a result. Note: This is a technique class. Time is insufficient to complete a project.

April 12 – Free Motion Quilting on Your Domestic Machine. \$35

Ever wanted just to get your quilt quilted without waiting on a longarmer's schedule? Are you sure there's a way to use your home sewing machine to quilt that wall hanging or quilt? Well, there is!



Steve Shuman is back to demonstrate how it's done. He'll guide us through domestic machine quilting with tips, techniques, and his abundance of humor.

May 10 – Quilt Drafting 101. \$35 with our own Jo Melis!

Have you ever wanted to make your own quilt designs? Or perhaps you've wished you could make a quilt from a picture on the internet or a tile pattern? Before you can do that, you need to master some simple drafting skills.



This workshop will cover the basics of breaking down a pattern into its simplest components,

resizing it, and calculating the yardage needed to make it. There is also an instruction on how to convert a regular pattern to a paper-pieced version.

If you have a design you lust after, bring a couple of copies of it along with you to the class and as a group, we will figure out the best way to translate your picture into a useable pattern!

This is not a sewing workshop! Paper and pencils are a must!

June 14 - Shirts! - with QBS's Kate Weber

Moda Shirt Quilt Blocks (9 am-3 pm) \$25.00

Get started on this quilt with some of your favorite fabrics. Pick a theme and go all in: Hawaiian, cars, or kid prints! How about a shirt for every month or holiday? The pattern is a free download from www.modafabrics.com/webfiles/fp_cfac-sunshine.pdf called Sunshine.



Kate has developed variations that enhance the design including adding pockets!

<u>Preparing to Make a T-Shirt Quilt</u> (1:30-3 pm) \$15.00 (T-shirt only fee)

Techniques and tricks for using t-shirts as quilt blocks.

July 15 - Open Sew. - No fee.

Come and work on whatever! Finish up a UFO, work on a Community Relations quilt, your choice!

August - Dark - No workshop

September 13 - Twinkle - \$35 with Jean Impey

This workshop is a companion to Jean's Thursday trunk show. Jean demonstrates how to make her quilt's eight-pointed star blocks in various sizes. This is an excellent scrap buster!

Size adjustable to your scrap stash!



October 11 - Many Moons. - \$35.00 with Jen Wagner of Snapdragon Quilts

"To me, the moon has long been a symbol of women, fertility, and motherhood as it cycles monthly. The original quilt design for Many Moons was a way for me to reflect and remember all the amazing women I cared for over the last 2 decades as I worked in women's health and delivered babies."



November 15 – Sewing Machine Hands-On. - \$35.00

steve Shuman leads this workshop investigating your sewing machine. Basic maintenance tips; how, when, and where to oil and clean. Steve will give service tips for each machine brand. Supply list: your machine(s), sewing machine tools (screwdriver, lint brush, etc.), fabric scraps, thread, and scissors. If multiple people have the same machine, he will demonstrate how to work on one while the rest of us observe and take notes.



Celery Salad (from Irene)

2 oz. apple juice

1/2 cup dried cranberries

3 cups celery, small dice


2 cups Fuji or Honeycrisp apples, peeled and sliced

1/2 cup chopped cilantro

2 oz. fresh lemon juice

Combine apple juice and cranberries in a saucepan. Bring to a boil and remove from heat. Let cool to room temperature. In a bowl combine celery and apples and mix in lemon juice. When cooled, mix in cranberries with apple juice and cilantro. Enjoy.



Worm Quilt - Bigger Behind Bars

(48" x 72")



Check out Show and Tell - Jo submitted this guilt.

Yardage

1 7/8 yds (20" bars, 27" border, 15" binding) 40 2-1/2" strips Backing Prints Solid

3 yds

Cnt

8 strips @ 2-1/2" 6 strips @ 4-1/2" 6 strips @ 2 1/2"


Binding

Border

Bars


Sew

Sew 4 print strips together. Measure the width of several stratas and squares diagonally from bottom left to top right. Rotate the other 2 measurement to crosscut them. From each strata, cut 2 of the take an average (will probably be about 8 1/4"). Use this squares before cutting diagonally.



Repeat with remaining 36 strips. (78 triangles needed, 2 will be left


bottoms to create six long equal-sized rectangle shapes about 5 1/2" Sew triangles together in strips with 13 triangles per row. Note that unseamed edge of the next triangle. Press, then trim the tops and the seamed edge of one triangle will always be next to the wide by 64" long.



Sew all the bar strips together to make one long sashing strip. Sew sashing between the long rectangles.

Sew on the top, bottom and side borders. Quilt and bind.
