


Making Faces – Ann has been teaching this wildly popular class for over 15 years, making it her most successful venture. Each participant designs and constructs an image that reflects herself, her likes and dislikes.

The Three Point Block – So deceptively simple, yet so versatile! You will never believe the multitude of layouts available until you try it yourself.

Improv for the Masses – Ann has a sneaky method of creating fabulous improvisational quilts. Let’s start with a few orphan blocks and a willingness to work outside the box!

On Point – A beautiful stained glass-style wall hanging with the illusion of curves created with simple overlays.



I want to thank Robin Gallagher of **Robin Quilts, etc.** for this technique. She used it in her pattern Lattice Patch.

Sew your favorite version of the Jelly Roll Race quilt. The one shown here (Fig. 1) does not have any additions and the ends are joined diagonally. You will also need a ruler with a 45° line.

From the bottom left corner, make a 45° cut as shown in Fig. 2.

Put the piece you just removed on top of the rest of the quilt (Fig. 3). Match up the right sides and sew in place as shown in Fig. 4.

From the point on the right side, make a 45° cut as shown in Fig. 5.

Put the piece you just removed on the left side of the rest of the quilt (Fig. 6). Match up the top edges and sew in place as shown in Fig. 7.

When the quilt is properly orientated, the pattern is on point as shown in Fig. 8. If need be, trim the edges to straighten them.

Add borders if you like. Quilt as desired and add the binding.

Note: This technique works for any rectangular quilt, even a square. However, a square quilt will come out rectangular.




Sara Jones




Lois Wilkinson


Dorothy Foral

Recipe from Lori Davies

CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE DELIGHT

- 1 tube (16-1/2 ounces) refrigerated chocolate chip cookie dough
- 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1 carton (12 ounces) frozen whipped topping, thawed, divided
- 3 cups cold 2% milk
- 1 package (3.9 ounces) instant chocolate pudding mix
- 1 package (3.4 ounces) instant vanilla pudding mix
- Optional: Chopped nuts and miniature semisweet chocolate chips or chocolate curls

Let cookie dough stand at room temperature for 5-10 minutes to soften. Press into an ungreased 13x9-in. baking pan. Bake at 350° until golden brown, 14-16 minutes. Cool on a wire rack.

In a large bowl, beat cream cheese and confectioners' sugar until smooth. Fold in 1-3/4 cups whipped topping. Spread over crust.

In another large bowl, whisk milk and pudding mixes for 2 minutes. Spread over cream cheese layer. Top with remaining whipped topping. Sprinkle with nuts and chocolate chips or curls if desired.

Cover and refrigerate until firm, 8 hours or overnight.

I brought this dessert to the workshop and everyone loved it. They asked for the recipe, and Kate suggested that it be included in the newsletter.





Doggy Face quilt block


Finished size 12"

Fabric needed:

- 1 Fat quarter for Dog
- 1 Fat quarter for Background
- Small scrap of black fabric for nose / eyes

From each fabric, cut

- 4 - $4\frac{7}{8}$ " squares
- 1 - $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square



****Line up all edges before sewing**

Construction

- Place 1 dog fabric and 1 background fabric right sides together
- Draw a diagonal line corner to corner
- Stitch $\frac{1}{4}$ " away on each side of drawn line
- Cut on drawn line; Press toward darker fabric.
(you will have 1 extra Half-Square-Triangle)
- Lay out squares and HST's as pictured. Stitch vertical, then horizontal rows.
- From black fabric, cut a 1" circle for the nose and a $1\frac{1}{4}$ " circle for the eyes.
- Cut the Eye circle in half.
- Applique the nose and eyes to the dog's face.


How to get to our meeting location.



The Arbor Road Church at 5336 E. Arbor Road, Long Beach is located south of Del Amo Blvd. and west of Bellflower Blvd.




Once you park, here is how you get to the basement where we meet.
